Course Description and Goals:

This course is a 5-week intensive, skill-oriented program of study designed to prepare international students for the demands of studying in an American university. This course is one part of a 15-week program of study.

The course will cover an extensive range of skills:

- listening to lectures
- reading critically
- note-taking strategies
- annotating a text
- paraphrasing and summarizing a text
- test-taking strategies
- improving control of grammar and sentence structure
- group collaboration
- writing for academic purposes
- developing proficiency in oral communication (formal and informal)

The instructor will assess student needs and interests and work with students to choose topics accordingly. Potential topics may include academic subjects (i.e. marketing, human resources, psychology, sciences), American culture, and current events. Students are encouraged to actively participate in the selection of materials.

Course Grades:

To pass the course, students must attend class regularly, participate actively, complete all assignments, and demonstrate their proficiency in all of the skill areas covered.

Grades for this course will be based on a standard university letter grade system:

A = 90-100% Excellent B = 80-89% Good C 70-79% Fair D = 60-69% Poor F = below 50% Failing

The instructor will provide scoring guidelines and rubrics for individual assignments as necessary.

Textbooks:

TOEFL Waiver

Students who wish to apply to a City College degree program may receive a TOEFL waiver if they pass this course with a B (80%) or higher.

CUNY Assessment Test (CAT)

International students who apply to CUNY colleges, including City College, must take the CUNY CAT, which is a test that measures college math, reading, and writing ability. (Exception: students who took and passed the SAT do not have to take the CUNY CAT). Ask your instructor about testing dates and test preparation.

Technology Requirements:

Students will be expected to regularly use email, Microsoft Word, and various websites such as YouTube, the New York Times, and Weebly to complete assignments. Students will also be required to create a Schoology account to access course materials and assignments.

This class will utilize the college computer lab at least 2 hours per week. In addition, you may be asked to bring your computer to class. If you would like to borrow a computer from the ELI office, please tell the teacher.
